Dear Mr. Haeg:

I am responding to your letter to Chief Justice Fabe dated December 2, 2006. Your case is under review by the Court of Appeals, and the justices of the Supreme Court cannot take any action in a pending case except through a proper court filing.

If you disagree with a non-final order of the Court of Appeals, you may file a petition for review with the Supreme Court under Appellate Rules 402-403. Otherwise, you can wait until the Court of Appeals issues its final decision, and if it is unfavorable to you, you may file a petition for hearing with the Supreme Court under Appellate Rules 302-303. Outside of such an official procedure, the justices of the Supreme Court cannot review your case or otherwise assist you.

Any documents sent to or filed with the courts must be served on opposing counsel.
