RESOLUTION CALLING FOR ALASKA'S GOVERNOR TO: (1) APPOINT AN INDEPENDENT COMMISSION TO PUBLICLY INVESTIGATE EVIDENCE OF CORRUPTION WITHIN ALASKA'S JUDICIAL AND EXECUTIVE BRANCHES, AND (2) MAKE THE 2022/23 KENAI GRAND JURY REPORT AND RECOMMENDATIONS PUBLIC

WHEREAS citizens are concerned about growing evidence of systemic corruption and cover up in Alaska's judicial and executive branches; and,

WHEREAS citizens are concerned about growing evidence that Grand Jury investigations into Alaska's judicial and executive branches are being unconstitutionally suspended; and,

WHEREAS these suspensions are particularly evident in the events that plagued a 2022/23 Kenai Grand Jury that investigated Alaska's judicial and executive branches, and had its report and recommendations to the public sealed before the public could see them; and,

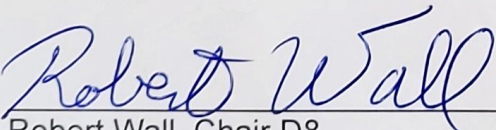
WHEREAS this sealing of public Grand Jury recommendations clearly violates Article 1, Section 8 of Alaska's Constitution: ***"The power of Grand Juries to investigate and make recommendations concerning the public welfare or safety shall never be suspended;"*** and,

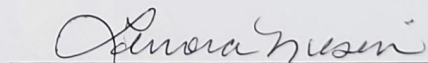
WHEREAS to effectively address similar entrenched government corruption in New York City, Mayor David Dinkins appointed an independent commission headed by Milton Mollen that investigated in public;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Alaska District 8 Republicans unequivocally call for the Governor of Alaska to immediately appoint an independent "Mollen" type commission that publicly investigates evidence of corruption within Alaska's judicial and executive branches; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Alaska District 8 Republicans unequivocally call for the Governor of Alaska to immediately take all action necessary to make the 2022/23 Kenai Grand Jury report and recommendations public.
